<p><b>7.1</b></p>	<p><b>Chairperson Report - Lynn Cameron</b></p> <p><b>Improving Parking in Scotland</b> - The Scottish Government recognise that the laws on parking are complex and can be confusing. They are undertaking a public consultation to explore how they can improve parking in Scotland. A copy of the consultation paper can be found at: <a href="http://bit.ly/consult-parking-imp">bit.ly/consult-parking-imp</a></p> <p><b>New 3 tier Planters</b> - Alva Community Council (ACC) have purchased 2 planters using grants from EDF. Following consultation with Clackmannanshire Council (CC) it has been agreed that they will be located on the right handside on entry to Alva from Menstrie and Tillicoultry. There will be a charge of approx. £300 for CC to create concrete bases for the planters. Sandra asked Elected Members if they could request waiver of this charge; Cllrs Balsillie and Drummond agreed to make the request but are not too hopeful given all the cuts in services. Lynn will continue to liaise with CC. Anne has arranged for the planters to be added to the insurance schedule.</p> <p><b>Giant Hogweed</b> - the sap can cause severe burns and poses a risk to people who are unaware of its potential for harm. The plant has been discovered at the corner of the Berryfield site, near Lovers Loan and Lynn has reported to Clackmannanshire Council who are going to deal with it. Lynn also contacted the owners of the land who will deal with the hogweed on their side of the fence. The school will inform pupils.</p>	<p>Lynn</p>
<p><b>7.2</b></p>	<p><b>Secretary Report - Linda Greig</b></p> <p><b>Alloa Advertiser</b> - A trainee reporter has been in touch because they are hoping to start a weekly double page spread solely dedicated to the Wee County's community councils. They are hoping to hear about and raise the issues that matter to local residents and they believe community councils are the best placed to know about these. They have said <i>'there will be occasions when we find something that we think should be important and will be asking community councils for their views/opinions'</i>.</p> <p>Ideally, they would hope to speak to someone from the community council on a weekly or biweekly basis as the Editor hopes to make this a permanent feature. Since there are nine community councils in Clackmannanshire they will not necessarily need something from Alva each week and similarly it could be that there are two or more stories coming in from one place in the same time.</p> <p>Linda agreed to contact them after tonight's meeting with the name of the community councillor who would be willing to be the regular contact. It was suggested and agreed that Sandra would do this as is already the Press Officer for CAPLan, Events, etc.</p> <p><b>Benches</b> - Linda has contacted the team leader of Transport &amp; Transportation at Clacks Council regarding the benches we requested for the Alva to Tillicoultry Cycle Path, this is the reply. <i>'We didn't have the spare budget last year but I have set aside some money this year to put in a few benches or seats on the cycle ways between Alva and Dollar. I have not worked out our programmes for this year but will try to get these benches in place sooner rather than towards the end of the year'</i>.</p> <p><b>Local &amp; General Elections</b> - The General Election on the 8th of June is going to affect Community Council interim elections, Leslie Ballie has said that she can confirm that the Elections Team will have to put the timetable back.</p> <p><b>Clacks Youth Council</b> - have written to us on behalf of the Youth Council for Clackmannanshire as when the new committee is elected they would like to link in more with community councils and have the young people attend our monthly meetings and represent the young people within their community.</p>

**INTRODUCTION**

I am Police Constable 247 James Miller, one of two Community Policing officers for the area stationed at Alloa Police Office, the other is PC 933 Brentt Chambers. You can contact us by calling 101 or by e-mail at [James.Miller@scotland.pnn.police.uk](mailto:James.Miller@scotland.pnn.police.uk) or [Brentt.Chambers@scotland.pnn.police.uk](mailto:Brentt.Chambers@scotland.pnn.police.uk).

Since the last meeting there have been 7 detected crimes and 3 undetected crimes recorded by police.

**PRIORITIES**

**ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR**

There were 3 recorded incidents of anti-social behaviour in the area, they are as follows;

- On 12<sup>th</sup> April 2017, 2 males were apprehended for controlled drugs, weapons and motoring offences in Greenhead, Alva. Both were held in custody and appeared at court the following day.
- On 19<sup>th</sup> April 2017, a male breached his domestic bail conditions in Johnstone Street, Alva and was apprehended for this offence.
- Between 30<sup>th</sup> April and 1<sup>st</sup> May 2017, the same male was reported for a stalking offence in Johnstone Street, Alva and apprehended for this.

**VANDALISM**

There was 1 recorded incident of vandalism in the area, it was as follows;

- On 6<sup>th</sup> May 2017, a 2 cars parked in West Johnstone Street, Alva had their wing mirrors knocked off. No suspect has been identified and enquiries are continuing.

**VIOLENCE**

There was 1 recorded incident of violence in the area, it was as follows;

- On 13<sup>th</sup> April 2017 a male and female were apprehended by police in the area near to Southcroft, Alva and reported for offences including robbery, abduction, weapon and knife offences.



### **ACQUISITIVE CRIME**

There have been 4 recorded incidents of acquisitive crime in the area, they are as follows;

- On 16<sup>th</sup> April 2017, a female failed to pay for taxi fare in The Nebit, Alva and was subsequently traced by police and apprehended for fraud.
- On 18<sup>th</sup> April 2017, a set of keys were stolen from the exterior lock of a residential property in The Wynd, Alva. The keys were not recovered and no suspect or motive has been identified.
- On 3<sup>rd</sup> May 2017, a domestic incident occurred in The Nebit, Alva which resulted in the theft of a motor vehicle. A suspect has been identified and enquiries are continuing.
- On 4<sup>th</sup> May 2017, a male was traced by police in Norton Street, Alva and reported for controlled drugs and multiple motoring offences.

### **ROAD TRAFFIC**

**It should be noted that traffic offences are routinely detected and dealt with by police without the need for them to be recorded. Several have already been mentioned along with other offences under the ASB section.**

- On 4 May 2017, a male was traced driving in Dickies Wells, Alva without valid insurance. He has been reported for the offence.

### **OTHER INCIDENTS OF NOTE**

Several fires have occurred at various locations on the hills in Alva over the last week with the most serious on 3<sup>rd</sup> May 2017. The Fire Brigade attended to deal with the blaze which lasted for a considerable period of time and covered a substantial area. Enquiries are continuing into the cause of the fire.

Any information regarding these fires or other criminality can be reported to police or Crimestoppers and can be done so anonymously.

Efforts are continuing to deal with parking problems in Alva by means of education and enforcement. No physical changes to the problematic areas appear to be imminent however consideration should be given to possible temporary solutions to ensure the safety of pedestrians whilst allowing access to delivery vehicles.



**ANY OTHER COMMUNITY ISSUES**

Police Scotland are currently seeking community involvement and input into the Policing 2026 strategy project. This will be the most comprehensive analysis ever undertaken of the demands policing faces and the sort of organisation we need to become to protect the people of Scotland over the next decade.
