5	Matters Arising from Previous Minutes – some matters arising are included in Police Report & Secretary's report. Brown Bins - Discussion took place regarding the charges now being applied for council tenants wishing to continue to use their brown bins, Council tenants are to contact Clackmannanshire Council to discuss their own preferred arrangements. Community Council put to elected councillors that it would have been preferable if all Clackmannanshire tenants had been given more sufficient notice of when charges would start as some tenants had been using their brown bins over the winter months but have decided not to pay the annual charge. Elected Cllrs were asked if arrangements could be made for one more free collection. Cllr DB said he would take the request back to council. Cllr DB suggested that tenants should keep their brown bins as the Scottish Government may in the process of time make it a statuary requirement for Councils to collect & dispose of garden waste. Police Report – Community Police Officer PC James Millar Monthly Report Attached.

With reference to the concerns raised at the last meeting regarding game and pest shooting near to Boll Farm, Alva, I can advise that 2 people were identified as the persons shooting on this space and were contacted shortly after. They attended at Alloa Police Station the same day and had a meeting with the PS Sharkey in her capacity as the Community Sergeant, myself and PC Allen in his capacity as the Community Constable for Tullibody.

Several concerns were raised during the meeting including -

- 1. Reports of firearms being discharged in the general direction towards the path and housing in Alva.
- 2. Permanent signage being on show.
- 3. Males approaching walkers on a guad in an aggressive manner.
- 4. An elevated hide being on council land.

In relation to point 1, the two people reassured police that any rifle discharges would be in the general direction away from Alva as there is a natural earth embankment which would provide a resting place for the spent ammunition. With regards to shotgun discharges, they advised that they would all be up into the air targeting birds but did state that untargeted pellets obviously do have to drop back down but wouldn't pose a risk.

In relation to point 2 and until correct legal or operating regulations could be established for signage, it was suggested that the permanent signage remains but that a red flag system is implemented, similar to what the army use on their ranges. This would require the signage being updated to make pedestrians aware of the system. The two people agreed to implement this and display red flags when shooting is being carried out. It is of note

In relation to point 3, the concerns were raised about how they present when speaking to members of the public. They denied being aggressive in any way and advised that they normally video record any discussions to keep themselves right but also because of aggression displayed towards them by persons who disagree with them shooting.

In relation to point 4, they conceded straight away that although the legs of the hide were on Marshalls land, the hide rested against a tree on council land. They volunteered to remove it and recite it elsewhere.

It was also made clear to them that while making their way towards the private land for shooting, all firearms should be carried in cases. They agreed and stated that this was their normal practice.

We will continue to monitor the situation and any criminal complaints should be reported to police via the 101 number.

Discussion continued regarding concerns from members of the community who feel they are losing their usual walking route & some damage to surrounding trees.

PC James Miller stressed that to his knowledge there is no criminality taking place & that the shooters were cooperating with the Police regarding the community concerns. Members of the community said they appreciated that this was the case.

APPENDIX 1

POLICE REPORT FEBRUARY 2020

ALVA COMMUNITY COUNCIL 10/02/2020

INTRODUCTION

The community police officers for Alva are PC 247 James Miller and PC 492 Steven Carrie, who are both stationed at Alloa Police Station. You can contact them by calling 101 or by e-mail at James.Miller@scotland.pnn.police.uk or Steven.Carrie@scotland.pnn.police.uk.

Police Scotland have recorded 14 crimes in the last month for Alva. Of these, 8 are detected and 4 are currently undetected, most of which are still under investigation.

PRIORITIES

ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

There were 6 recorded incidents of anti-social behaviour in the area over the last month, as follows;

On 14th January 2020 at a residential dwelling in Dalmore Drive, Alva, police recovered possession quantities of what were believed to be controlled drugs. These will be tested and owner will reported for any relevant offences.

On 17th January 2020 at Alva Medical Practice, West Johnstone Street, Alva, a male was apprehended for threatening behaviour and for being in possession of a knife. He was held in police custody to appear at court the next lawful day.

On 17th January 2020 at The Nebit, Alva, a domestic incident occurred during which a male was threatening. He was apprehended and will be reported to the Procurator Fiscal.

On 23rd January 2020 at Craighorn Road, Alva, a drugs search warrant was executed during which controlled drugs were recovered. A male was held in police custody and appeared at court for controlled drugs offences.

On 26th January 2020 at The Green, Alva, a road rage incident occurred which resulted in two males making off after committing disorder and road traffic offences. Police are following a positive line of enquiry.

On 2nd February 2020 at Caroline Crescent, Alva, a female was arrested and held in police custody after being threatening towards a family member.

VANDALISM

There were 2 recorded incidents of vandalism in the area over the last month, as follows;

Sometime between 27th December 2019 and 30th January 2020, a caravan window was forced and damaged at Balquharn Farm, Alva after which the inside was used but no property was stolen. No suspect has been identified and enquiries are continuing.

On 27th January 2020 at the Johnstone Arms, Stirling Street, Alva, several windows were smashed at the front of the building and a car scratched at the rear. Police have identified a suspect who they are actively trying to trace.

VIOLENCE

There were 5 recorded incidents of violence in the area over the last month, as follows;

On 14th January 2020 at Alva Academy, a male pupil was subject to a minor assault by another pupil. The Schools Based Officer investigated the incident and the matter was dealt with using the most appropriate disposal.

On 16th January 2020, a series of domestic offending and road traffic offences were reported at various loci in Alva and Tillicoultry. The male responsible was arrested and held in police custody to appear at court the next lawful day.

On 17th January 2020 within a residential dwelling at The Nebit, Alva, a domestic incident occurred which resulted in male reporting that he had been assaulted by two others. One suspect is still outstanding and enquiries are continuing.

On 27th January 2020 at Alva Academy, three male pupils were dealt with by the Schools Based Officer for an assault on another pupil. Those involved have been reported for this incident.

On 29th January 2020 at The Cross Keys, Stirling Street, Alva, an altercation between male associates resulted in one of them being assaulted with a pool cue. Police are actively trying to trace the male responsible.

ACQUISITIVE CRIME

There were no recorded incidents of acquisitive crime in the area over the last month.

ROAD TRAFFIC

There was 1 recorded incidents of a road traffic offences in the area over the last month, as follows;

On 7th February 2020 at East Stirling Street, Alva, a driver was found to be driving without the correct licence or insurance. He was charged and will be reported to the Procurator Fiscal.

It should be noted that other traffic offences are routinely detected and dealt with by police without the need for them to be recorded.

OTHER INCIDENTS OF NOTE

ANY OTHER COMMUNITY ISSUES

Concerns raised regarding the authorised use of firearms at Boll Farm have been progressed by the Community Policing Team with PC Miller visiting the site and a meeting at Alloa Police Station with those involved. An email communicating the outcomes from this meeting was passed to the Community Council. PC Miller has also consulted with the Police Scotland's local Wildlife Officer regarding the reports received. Further communication will take place with the landowner and the authorised users of the land in this respect but no criminality has been identified at this time.

Community officers will continue to address parking and driving issues in Alva. Numerous tickets and warnings have been issued and will continue to be issued where appropriate. Please continue to report any concerns to police on 101 or directly to ourselves via e-mail. PC Miller has spoken with staff at Clackmannanshire Council who have provided an estimated start time of July for the planned streetscape enhancements to Stirling Street, Alva. This will hopefully address many of the parking issues including parking on the pavement and within the bus stop.

PC Miller has also requested the refresh of parking restriction lines within the ward area and this will commence over the next few months as the weather improves.

In relation to parking concerns raised at the last meeting, PC Carrie has attended at the commercial premises at the junction with Stirling Street and Queen Street with a view to raising awareness of these concerns and the actions that police will take.

The Clackmannanshire Community Team will continue to target local drug dealers utilising intelligence received from the community. This intelligence is essential to enable officers to act against those involved and we encourage any information to be passed to the police or via Crimestoppers.
